Continuing its social work and philanthropic gesture, Delhi Printers' Association once again celebrated the Printers' Day at central city's well-known orphanage 'Arya Anathalaya' on February 24, 2024 by serving mid-day meal to about 700 inmate students on February 24, 2024.

In order to commemorate the birth anniversary of the Father of Printing Johannes Gutenberg of Germany - who invented the Art of Printing in the 15th century - printers celebrate the marvel of humanity, marked as Printers' Day, in their different styles on 24th February every year.

having designed and built the first known mechanised printing press in Europe. In 1455 he used to print the Gutenberg Bible which is one of the earliest books in the world to be printed from movable type. During a period of three years he printed only 180 Bibles. Subsequently, the printing revolution contributed to the spread of knowledge, discoveries and literacy in Renaissance

Soon after their classes were over at 1.30 pm, their teachers first lined up the junior students for taking meal from the hands of some of DPA's former Presidents, Office Bearers and EC Members who distributed different food items one by one. It was a pleasant sight to see the students sitting on rows of mats and saying their prayer before enjoying the meal.
